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

PROJECT AIM

Developing and institutionalising trauma-sensitive learning methodologies to support students affected by war and forced displacement



Methodology

Development of a systemic model of trauma-sensitive teaching adapted to the realities of Ukrainian universities.

Teacher Training

Training at least 100 teachers in the principles of adaptive and emotionally safe learning.

Student Support

Conducting pilot activities that support students' emotional well-being and adaptation in challenging circumstances.

Digital Hub

Creation of an online platform with resources for instructors and students: methodologies, instructions, and exercises for stabilisation.

Policy and Sustainability

Institutionalisation of trauma-sensitive principles in university development strategies, recommendations for the Ministry of Education and Science.

FOUR PRIORITIES OF THE PROJECT

(WORK PACKAGES)



INSTRUCTORS (WP1)

Teaching and supporting

Preparing instructors to work with students who have experienced trauma. Creating training courses, instructions, and practical lesson plans.



STUDENTS (WP2)

Helping to adapt

Conducting support activities, creating programmes to strengthen emotional resilience and engage students in the project.



INTEGRATION (WP3)

Embedding into the system

Introduction of a trauma-sensitive approach into policies, educational programmes and internal documents of universities. Institutionalisation of changes.



SUSTAINABILITY (WP4)

Expanding and consolidating

Disseminating results, holding conferences, collaborating with other initiatives, creating conditions for long-term impact.

EXPECTED RESULTS



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An official model of trauma-sensitive teaching adapted to Ukrainian realities and with recommendations for various courses.



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Access to digital resources, exercises, lesson plans, coping techniques, and self-help tips — 24/7.



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A typical framework for changes to policies, curricula, strategies and local acts (regulations, syllabi, etc.).

At least 100 certified TST specialists in regional and relocated higher education institutions capable of disseminating the changes further.



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Building a community of instructors who use a trauma-sensitive approach and become change agents in their higher education institutions.



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Tools for student participation in the design of learning spaces: surveys, feedback, engagement.



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An intersectoral and international partnership formed around the challenges of trauma-sensitive education.
